His research interests are creativity, educational assessment, educational leadership and special education. <u>Heidi Lesscher</u> – Associate Professor at Universiteit Utrecht, behavioural neuroscientist, expert in addiction and play research.

Within single paper sessions, 53 papers will be presented. Furthermore, during ten symposia, 34 papers will be discussed. Moreover, during the poster session, 10 posters will be presented.

#### **Emergency calls**

#### Public transport and taxi service

Warsaw is well connected via public transport. The following public transport options are available:

- metro
- bus/ nightbus
- tram
- taxi/ Uber/ Bolt

#### **Public Transport**

Various types of public transport tickets are available which can be purchased online or at the machine at the stop. For buses, tickets can be purchased and validated on the vehicle. The ticket needs to be validated before use. A three day ticket can be purchased for 36zl (approx. 8,40€). A useful application for navigating public transport in the city and purchasing tickets is Jakdojade (Play store: Jakdojade: public transport – Apps on Google Play | App store: Jakdojade - Timetables on the App Store).

#### Cash

The currency in Poland is the Polish Złoty (PLN) 1 PLN = 100 groszy Coins: 1 PLN, 2 PLN, 5 PLN and 10, 20 and 50 groszy Banknotes: 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 PLN

#### Currency Exchange

Usually,

1 PLN ≈ 0.24 EUR 1 PLN ≈ 0.24 US Dollar

Currency should be exchanged at a registered exchange point.

Złoty can also be withdrawn at ATMs which are widely spread throughout the city. Note that there may be a fee for withdrawing money from a foreign currency.

#### Payment method

Besides cash, credit (e.g. Visa/ Mastercard) and debit cards (e.g. Maestro) are widely accepted. Note that your bank may charge a fee for the exchange when card payments are made.

#### Food and beverages

Tap water in Warsaw in general is safe for consumption.



#### **Conference venue**

The conference will take place at the Faculty of Modern Languages building, which is located at **Dobra 55, 00-312 Warszawa**. # **Presentation guidelines**



### Paper sessions Symposia sessions Poster sessions

The conference committee kindly requests that presenters adhere to the allotted time for their presentations. This ensures a smooth session and a dynamic conference experience. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Outlined below are the event formats and presentation guidelines for the various sessions. An organizing committee member will be present in each room to assist with questions and technical issues.

#### Paper sessions

Each paper session comprises three to four individual contributions, grouped by presentation topic. The sessions are chaired by a member of the organizing committee, who will begin with a brief welcome and keep track of the time throughout the session. Individual presentations should last around 20 minutes (if there are four contributions) to 25 minutes (if there are three contributions), including time for questions and answers.

As a presenter, please arrive at your assigned room 15 minutes before your session starts (check the conference program for room details). An assistant will be available in the room to support you. Basic presentation equipment (laptop, projector, remote control) will be provided. If you need additional equipment, please bring it yourself. If presenting digitally, ensure you have your presentation on a USB flash drive as a PowerPoint (pptx) file. It is highly recommended to save and bring a backup copy of your presentation as a PDF.

#### Symposia

A symposium consists of three to four individual contributions, followed by a discussion on the preceding presentations. Each contribution is allotted 15 minutes (for four contributions) or 20 minutes (for three contributions). The symposium sessions will be chaired. As a presenter, please arrive at your assigned room 15 minutes before your session begins (refer to the conference program for room details). An assistant will be present in the room to support you. Basic presentation equipment (laptop, projector, remote control) will be provided. If you require additional equipment, please bring it yourself. If you are using a digital presentation, ensure you bring it on a USB flash drive as a PowerPoint (pptx) file. It is highly recommended to save and bring a backup copy of your presentation as a PDF.



The poster session is organized into a session of ten posters.

Please prepare your posters in size A1 (59.4 cm x 84.1 cm - vertical orientation).

A member of the organizing committee will chair the session.

The chair will begin with a brief welcome and will keep track of the time throughout the session. Each participant will then present their poster with a brief verbal presentation (maximum of 5 minutes), highlighting key findings. After each presentation, there will be time for clarification questions. Following all presentations, attendees are invited to circulate among the posters and engage in discussions with the presenters.

As a presenter, please arrive 10 minutes before the start of your session. Poster session presentations are scheduled on Thursday, 11 July at 13:30.

On Wednesday 10 July, visit the registration and information desk, where a member of the organizing committee will collect your poster.

The posters will remain displayed during the conference on Thursday and Friday to reach a larger audience. At the end of the conference or when you're leaving, you can collect your poster.

**Title:** Expanding conceptions of play-based learning: promising paths and pedagogical challenges

Research examining play-based learning has shared both promising and problematic findings. There is great promise in the improved learning of children in controlled studies comparing play-based learning to traditional didactic instruction. This promise is counterbalanced by inconsistent findings and dichotomous recommendations for implementation. Many have theorized about the causes of these challenges, including problematizing the lack of agreement and continuing debates surrounding definitions of play-based learning, including the problematic position that adults do not belong in children's play. This presentation will outline the impact of this research on educational practice and consider the lessons researchers could learn from classroom realities. Data from a decade of studies in Canadian classrooms will be used to support the examination of what we know about play-based learning, what we still need to learn, and how teachers are negotiating these complexities in their practice.

Title: Healthy play better coping: An interdisciplinary perspective on play

#### Abstract:

Play is considered essential for the healthy social, emotional and cognitive development of individuals. A lot of our current knowledge about the impact of play on the development of brain and behaviour stems from play research in rats. We know that rats that were isolated during the stage of their lives in which they play most, essentially depriving them of social play behaviour, develop reduced and dysfunctional social behaviour, enhanced anxiety-like behaviour and impaired cognitive control. Our recent studies on social play in rats have shown for example that individual variations in social play in rats predict the resilience to loss of control over substance use. Moreover, I will show data for rats that were allowed to play in a more risky environment, which resulted in greater cognitive control and corresponding long-lasting changes in the functioning of the prefrontal cortex.

In my lecture I will also discuss how these findings translate to humans and what the implications are of restrictions in play, for example for children that suffer from a chronic disease.

Title: Feedback for Creativity

Creativity is a skill that can be cultivated; indeed, numerous creativity training programs have proven effective in enhancing the creative thinking abilities of children, adolescents, and adults. Among the crucial elements that drive this learning process is the feedback people receive. However, despite its importance, our understanding of how feedback influences creativity and what types of feedback are most effective is quite limited. This talk delves into the role of feedback for creative thought and action by discussing recent research from the creativity literature, including a unique large-scale naturalistic experiment on almost 40,000 participants. It further shows how and when feedback works or doesn't work, what types of feedback are particularly beneficial, and when pseudofeedback can lead to losing creative chances.
