Language education assumes raising general language competence of students (assuming that they start at B2 level), with a particular emphasis put on skills necessary in using academic language. All materials used to develop receptive skills (reading and listening with comprehension) and productive skills (taking part in a discussion, giving a presentation, making notes and writing summaries and papers) will focus on subjects connected with art and education.
