Welcome

We are pleased to welcome you to Warsaw, to this international conference on the legacy of Jane Addams, the founder of Hull-House and Nobel Peace Prize Laureate:

In the Spirit of Jane Addams: Global Dialogue, Social Change, Community Engagement in the 21st Century

The conference is organized by the Faculty of Education at the University of Warsaw (Poland) and the Jane Addams Center for Civic Engagement at Rockford University (US).

Conference Objectives:

Social reformer and peace advocate Jane Addams and her legacy are reflected in the work of current-day practitioners, academics, and policy-makers in a wide range of areas that impact human lives and social institutions. This conference aims to recognize the value of Addams' work and legacy among a variety of internationally important contemporary contexts and to reflect on how Addams inspires in the 21st century.

The timing of the conference recognizes the 165th Anniversary of Jane Addams' birthday in 1860, the 90th Anniversary of her death in 1935, and the 136th Anniversary of the opening of Hull House in Chicago in 1889. All fans and critics of the way Addams tried to make the world a better place to live are encouraged to join us at the conference to network and discuss what Addams' legacy means to us today.

A conference of this sort intersects with current debates on issues such as voting rights, immigration, child welfare, world peace, public health, and gender, racial, and economic inequality, as well as community development, democracy, social progress, and social work.

We welcome proposals from academics and from practitioners examining the work and legacy of Jane Addams in connection to contemporary practices, views and reflections.

Among the various questions that might be addressed are the following:

- How does Jane Addams' influence intersect with current debates or issues globally?
- In what ways does Jane Addams inspire the social sciences and humanism in the 21st century?
- How has Jane Addams contributed to research methodologies?
- How can Addams' ideals be put into practice in our communities and our world of today?

Keynote Speakers

At this conference, we are hosting two distinguished keynote speakers.

Prof. Maurice Hamington – a Professor of Philosophy and Affiliate Faculty in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at Portland State University. He specializes in the theory and application of feminist care ethics. His works on Jane Addams include co-editing, along with Pat Shields and Joseph Soeters, the Oxford Handbook of Jane Addams (2023) and editing Feminist Interpretations of Jane Addams (2010), as well as writing Embodied Care: Jane Addams, Maurice Merleau-Ponty and Feminist Ethics (2004). He contributed the Jane Addams entry in the online Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy. His latest book, Revolutionary Care: Commitment and Ethos (Routledge 2024), argues for a care revolution right now and that everyone can participate. He is the co-author of Care Ethics and Poetry (2019) with Ce Rosenow. Hamington has edited or co-edited Feminism and Hospitality: Care Ethics, Religion, and Spiritual Traditions (2022), Care Ethics in the Age of Precarity (2021), Care Ethics and Political Theory (2015), Applying Care Ethics to Business (2011), Socializing Care (2006), and Gender in the Host/Guest Relationship (2010). He has also authored numerous publications on the philosophy of Jane Addams.

Prof. Danielle Lake – the Director of Design Thinking and Associate Professor in Human Service Studies at Elon University. Inspired by the work of Jane Addams, her teaching, research, and service explore the potential and the challenges of emergent, relational, place-based design for addressing wicked problems and transforming social systems. As the director of the Center for Design Thinking, she oversees a place-based storytelling and bridge-building initiative informed by Addams's own social justice storytelling initiatives. Her scholarship on Addams includes "Feminist Pragmatist Design: Evolutionary Systems Change" (2023), "Jane Addams, Social Design, and Wicked Problems" (2022), "Situating Democracy and Social Ethics" (2021), "Emergent, Relational Revolution" (2021), and more. She is co-author of the Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy entry on Feminist pragmatism.

Public transport and taxi service

Warsaw is well connected via public transport. The following public transport options are available:

- metro
- bus/ nightbus
- tram
- taxi/ Uber/ Bolt

Public transport

Various types of public transport tickets are available which can be purchased online or at the machine at the stop. For buses, tickets can be purchased and validated on the vehicle. Tickets need to be validated before use. A 3-day ticket can be purchased for 36 zł (approx. 9.90 USD).

Means of payment and currency

Cash

The currency in Poland is the Polish Złoty (PLN) 1 PLN = 100 groszy

Coins: 1 PLN, 2 PLN, 5 PLN and 10, 20 and 50 groszy

Banknotes: 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 PLN

Currency exchange

Usually,

1 PLN ≈ 0.24 EUR

1 PLN ≈ 0.27 USD

Currency should be exchanged at a registered exchange point.

Złoty can also be withdrawn at ATMs which are widely spread throughout the city. Note that there may be a fee for withdrawing money from a foreign currency.

Payment method

Besides cash, credit (e.g. Visa/ Mastercard) and debit cards (e.g. Maestro) are widely accepted. Note that your bank may charge a fee for the exchange when card payments are made.

Food and Beverages

Tap water in Warsaw, in general, is safe for consumption.



Conference venue
